Instructions:

Applicants must be members of the PRTAA in good standing and the dog in question must be owned or co-owned by the applicant. Dog must be registered with the AKC which would include ILP registration.

The Natural Hunting or Earthworking programs of the PRTAA and AWTA are recognized. In addition, where the organization requires multiple working successes in order to award a titling certificate, copies of Earth Work Evaluation Forms may be submitted in lieu of a certificate. Similarly, where a dog has already received certification from an organization, subsequent successful earthworking events may be documented and submitted in the same format as the organization would require for certification. For example, once a dog earns its PRTAA or AWTA Working Certificate, subsequent earthworking events may receive credit toward the Earthworking Medal Program and Hall of Fame when submitted with the same documentation required to obtain a PRTAA or AWTA Working Certificate. Witnesses must be either PRTAA or AWTA members.

A dog will only receive credit one time for each earthworking event, regardless of whether it might be submitted to more than one organization. The applicant should identify what level of award they are seeking and to identify the quarry successfully worked. Recognized quarry includes groundhog, raccoon, opossum, fox, and badger. In addition, credit may be received for additional quarry on a case-by-case basis to be determined by the PRTAA Earthworking Committee. Skunk is never an acceptable quarry. Verification of earthworking in the form of earthworking certificates or their equivalents must be attached to this application.
