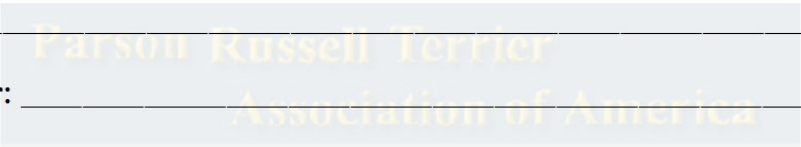

Eligibility



The Versatile Breeder of the Year is awarded based on the points for legs earned by PRTs for which the applicant is the breeder (or co-breeder) of record. Applicants must be members of the PRTAA in good standing, however, the breeder may submit points for any PRT for which the applicant is the breeder (or co-breeder) of record, regardless of whether the PRT is owned by a member of the PRTAA. However, the breeder may only submit points for PRTs that are AKC registered. An ILP may also be deemed sufficient registration, except where points for conformation events are sought.

Determination of the Versatile Breeder of the Year

The Versatile Breeder of the Year will be determined based on the number of points accumulated, the breeder accumulating the most points over the course of a year will be awarded the title of “PRTAA Versatile Breeder of the Year.” In the event of a tie, the breeder with points in the greatest number of areas will be awarded the title of “PRTAA Versatile Breeder of the Year.”

In the event that the tie is still not broken, the award will be shared.

Calculating Points

Breeders will receive points for every leg earned by PRTs for which the applicant is the breeder (or co-breeder) of record in agility, earthdog, tracking, Lure Coursing, obedience, rally, conformation, earthwork, Flyball or extreme sports.



No more than 50% of the breeder's points may come from any one area of competition. In the event that more than 50% of the breeder's points come from one area of competition, the Versatility Committee may only count the number of points in that area that are equal to or less than 50% of their total points.

Example: Spotted Dog Kennels earns 100 conformation points in one year, 25 points in agility, and 30 points in earthdog, for a total of 155 points. However, more than 50% of Spotted Dog Kennels' points come from one area

(conformation). Spotted Dog Kennels has 55 points from the other areas, therefore, Spotted Dog Kennels can only count 55 of their conformation points toward their Versatile Breeder of the Year points, giving them a total of 110 versatility points.

Examples are included for your information only; you do not need to perform these calculations as they will be performed by the Versatility Committee.
