Instructions:

Please fill out the dog's information above in full and fill out the "Points Earned" information at the bottom of the page. Send this with documentation.

Applicants must be members of the PRTAA in good standing for the current calendar year and the dog in question must be owned or co-owned by the applicant. In the case of a co-owned dog, the dog's primary residence must be with the applicant. Dog must be registered with the AKC. An ILP is considered sufficient registration except where applicant seeks points from Conformation.

Calculating Points

No more than 50% of the dog's points may come from any one area of competition. In the event that more than 50% of the dog's points come from one area of competition, the dog may only count the number of points in that area that are equal to or less than 50% of their total points.

Example: Spot earns 100 conformation points in one year, 25 points in agility, and 30 points in earthdog, for a total of 155 points. However, more than 50% of Spot's points come from one area (conformation). Spot has 55 points from the other areas; therefore, Spot can only count 55 of his conformation points toward his versatility points, giving him a total of 110 versatility points.

The Versatile Dog of the Year will be determined based on the number of points accumulated. The dog accumulating the most points over the course of a year will be awarded the title of "PRTAA Versatile Dog of the Year." In the event of a tie, the dog with



points in the greatest number of areas will be awarded the title of “PRTAA Versatile Dog of the Year.” In the event that tie is still not broken, the award will be shared.

“Safety” legs that are not required for a title will not count towards awards, with the exception of those legs earned by dogs competing in for Endurance Earthdog, Excellent B in agility, Obedience Dblq for UDX or OTCH or Rally for RAE level.
